Course Summary

Description

This course will provide the student with the conventions and the techniques to write user guides that are a pleasure to read and that achieve the desired result of letting the reader get on with the job of using the software, assembling the hardware or simply enjoying the product, rather than studying the manual endlessly.

Objectives

At the completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Apply the user guide writing process to improve quality and reduce time writing
- Distinguish the reader's perspective from the system designer's
- Plan user guides according to their use in the field
- Conduct a task analysis to determine what the user will actually do with the document
- Design and format the contents of the user guide for the reader's quick reference
- Apply current conventions for page and document design
- Employ five fail-safe methods for structured procedures
- Save time while drafting your document
- Troubleshoot your manual to ensure that it is readable, accurate, complete, and usable
